	 Say: "This week, we have been noticing and talking about all of the ways that we are different. Today, I am going to play you a song called, "What I Am" by Will.I.Am and the Sesame Street puppets. In this song, Will.I.Am describes himself in many different ways." Play the YouTube video clip of "What I Am". You can find it at: www.youtube.com/watch?v=cyVzjoj96vs After listening to the song once or twice, ask the students to share some of the words that Will.I.Am used to describe himself. You can write down their ideas on chart paper. Possible responses include: proud, musical, smart, etc.

	 Explain the instructions for the activity: "I am going to give everyone a copy of the lyrics to the song, "What I Am". You will notice that there are several blank spaces for you to fill in. I want you to write down words that describe different qualities about who you are. You can use our anchor chart, ideas from the song, and/or your own ideas to complete this work." Distribute a hand-out with the lyrics of the song printed on them. Use blank lines to replace the descriptive words in the song. Students will re-create their own version of the song using words to describe themselves.

6. Gather on the carpet and play the song again. Encourage everyone to use their own lyric sheet to sing along. When Will.I.Am describes himself, invite the students to shout out the words that they have written about themselves.7. Send the lyric sheets home and encourage students to teach the song to someone in their family.
